

**A Bill to Provide Inmate Rehabilitation**

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here  
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: All inmates suffering from drug abuse or drug usage shall be enrolled in  
4 12-week Cognitive-Behavioral Therapy (CBT) in last 12 weeks of their  
5 sentence.

6 Article II: Cognitive-Behavioral Therapy shall be defined as a 12-week, goal-  
7 oriented psychotherapy treatment that takes a hands-on, practical approach  
8 to problem solving and prepares participants to re-enter life outside of  
9 prison.

10 Article III: This legislation shall be implemented 6 months after passage.

11 Article IV: The Department of Justice and Bureau of Prisons will be responsible for  
12 the implementation of this legislation and will reduce federal funding for  
13 prisons for non-compliance at their own discretion.

14 Article V: All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be  
15 declared null and void.

**A Bill to Require Zoos to be converted to Wildlife Sanctuaries and/or Wildlife  
Rehabilitation Centers**

1 Be it enacted by this Student Congress here assembled that:

2 Article I: In order to eradicate the use of animals for human entertainment and  
3 amusement, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Agency shall oversee the  
4 conversion of all zoos to wildlife rehabilitation centers and/or sanctuaries  
5 over the course of the next 20 years.

6 Article II: A Zoo is to be defined as an enterprise that acquires animals via purchase,  
7 breeding, trade, or capture in order to satisfy the enterprises' business  
8 interests. A Sanctuary is defined as an enterprise that acquires only  
9 animals that can no longer survive in the wild. A Rehabilitation Center is  
10 defined as an enterprise that works toward the healing and release of  
11 animals back into the wild.

12 Article III: This Bill will go into effect February 1st, 2018 with no further zoo animals  
13 being acquired by traditional zoos.

14 Article IV: The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Agency will be tasked with writing and  
15 implementing the new guidelines under the USDA Animal Welfare Act.

16 Article V: All laws or portions of laws that are in conflict with this bill are hereby  
17 considered null and void.

**The Ukrainian Accountability Act of 2018**

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensics League Student Congress here  
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: The United States shall put six billion (\$6,000,000,000) USD towards  
4 a Ukraine Investment Fund to combat corruption.

3 Article II: The “Ukraine Investment Fund” shall be an initiative funding the United  
4 States Agency for International Development’s current projects targeting  
5 corruption with the Government of Ukraine.

6 Article III: This bill will go into effect starting October 1, 2019.

7 Article IV: The United States Agency for International Development and Department  
8 of Defense shall oversee the implementation of this legislation.

9 Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation are now considered null and void.

**A Bill to Renew DACA**

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here  
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: Deferred Action for Childhood Arrival shall hereby be renewed for 20  
4 years.

5 Article II: DACA is an American immigration policy that allowed some individuals  
6 who entered the country illegally as minors to receive a renewable two-  
7 year period of deferred action from deportation and to be eligible for a  
8 work permit.

9 Article III: This Bill will be implemented on November 25<sup>th</sup> of 2018 and will last for  
10 20 years.

11 Article IV: The Department of Homeland Security will oversee the enforcement of the  
12 bill along with the specific enforcement mechanism.

13 Article V: All laws in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be declared null and  
14 void.

**A Bill to Replace Medicare, Medicaid, and Social Security Systems with a Flat-Tax and  
Universal Health Care Program**

1 Be it enacted by this PBCFL Student Congress here assembled that:

2 Article I: The programs of Medicare, Medicaid, and Social Security will be removed  
3 in favor of implementing a flat-tax and universal health care program.

4 Article II: Medicare is defined as a federal health insurance program for people who  
5 are 65 or older. Medicaid is defined as federal health insurance program  
6 for low-income and needy civilians, along with those with physical  
7 impairments, and children. Social Security is defined as a program that  
8 allocates public funds to those who are retired, unemployed, or disabled.

9 Flat-tax is defined under this legislation as a 20% tax on initial income,  
10 and a 10% tax on capital gains. Universal health care is defined as full  
11 coverage for every citizen - provided by the government - without  
12 premiums and/or deductibles.

13 Article III: This legislation will go into effect by the beginning of FY 2020.

14 Article IV: The Department of Health and Human Services will be responsible for the  
15 implementation of this bill. The Ways and Means Committee will be  
16 responsible for the final distribution of funding for current Social Security  
17 recipients.

18 Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

**A Bill to Increase Federal Funding of Planned Parenthood**

1 Be it enacted by this congress here assembled that:

2 Article I: The federal government should increase planned parenthood funding  
3 through Medicaid reimbursements and Title X so that they can provide  
4 their many services to people who require them.

5 Article II: Planned Parenthood is a non-profit organization that does research on and  
6 gives reproductive health care services to its patrons. It is currently funded  
7 federally through public health care programs such as Medicaid and Title  
8 X.

9 Article III: This legislation will be implemented in the 2018 fiscal year.

10 Article IV: The United States Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) will  
11 ultimately enforce this legislation.

12 Article V: All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be  
13 declared null and void.

**A Bill to Require Candidates for President to Release Medical Records Before Accepting  
Party Money**

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach County Forensic League Student Congress here  
2 assembled that:

3 Article I. We shall mandate that all candidates for the office of President of the  
4 United States from a major political party shall, release medical records.

5 Article II: Major political party shall be defined as Democratic and Republican.  
6 Medical records shall be defined as all transcripts from an examination by  
7 a general practitioner or specialist, and any and all medications prescribed  
8 to the candidate.

9 Article III. This bill shall be implemented on January 1, 2019. This bill will last  
10 indefinitely.

11 Article IV. The Federal Election Commission shall be responsible for the  
12 implementation of all actions related to this bill.

13 Article V: All other laws that are in conflict with this bill shall hereby be declared  
14 null and void.

**A Bill to Implement a National Car Program for the Poor**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 ARTICLE 1. The government will subsidize the purchase of automobiles by  
3 applicants living under 225% of the Federal Poverty Line. Each  
4 applicant must be licensed to drive and must be able to show a  
5 significant need for a vehicle by submitting an application to the  
6 Department of Health and Human Services.

7 ARTICLE 2. “Subsidize” shall be defined as financial support to cover 70-80%  
8 of an automobile’s initial cost. The “Federal Poverty Line” shall be  
9 defined as the measure of income calculated by the Department of  
10 Health and Human Services to determine eligibility for Medicaid  
11 and other programs.

12 ARTICLE 3. This legislation will go into effect in the FY 2019.

13 ARTICLE 4. The Department of Health and Human Services will be tasked to  
14 create an application including the finances of the applicant, the  
15 need for a vehicle, and the applicant’s ability to drive to earn this  
16 subsidy. The Department of Health and Human Services will  
17 receive \$5 billion annually to assist in paying for the vehicles.

18 ARTICLE 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null  
19 and void.

**A Bill to End Affirmative Action in U.S Colleges and Universities**
