

**A Bill to End Support for the Saudi Air Coalition**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Article 1. The United States government shall end and withdraw all material support  
3 and cancel any current shipments or transfers of material support to the  
4 Saudi Air Coalition.

5 Article 2. Material Support shall be defined as any arms, drones, or technology  
6 manufactured to attack and destroy a target or to collect information that  
7 aids a military, funding, and troops.

8 Article 3. This legislation will be effective immediately after passage.

9 Article 4. The Department of State shall oversee negotiations for the methods of  
10 withdrawal and the Department of Defense shall oversee the withdrawal of  
11 material support.

12 A. Within a month after the implementation of this legislation,  
13 Congress shall demand a report from the Department of Defense  
14 demonstrating the progress of the withdrawal.

15 B. If any details of the report have been found to be false, the  
16 Department of Defense shall have 30% of its funding withdrawn.

17 Article 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here  
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: Manned vehicles create congestion on our roadways, contribute to  
4 pollution, and cause injury or death to millions of US citizens each year.  
5 Thus, to improve the safety and efficiency of our roadways, we must  
6 replace all manually operated vehicles with autonomous vehicles.

7 Article II: 1) Manned means transporting, operated by, or performed by a  
8 human or humans.

9 2) A vehicle refers to any means in or by which someone travels or  
10 something is carried or conveyed.

11 3) An autonomous car is a vehicle that can guide itself without human  
12 conduction.

13 Article III: This bill will be partially implemented by 2025 in order to allow for  
14 infrastructure development and fully implemented in all fifty states by  
15 2035.

16 Article IV: The Department of Transportation, in conjunction with the Federal  
17 Highway Administration, will oversee the enforcement of this bill.

18 Article V: All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be  
19 declared null and void.

3 Article I. All teachers be trained and provided with firearms as a means of

6 Article II: Violent acts shall be defined as actions of an individual or individuals on  
7 the school campus, armed or otherwise, who intend to do harm to any  
8 other person on the campus.

9 Article III. This bill shall be implemented at the beginning of the 2017-18 school  
10 year, pending the readiness of teachers. This bill will last indefinitely.

11 Article IV. The Department of Homeland Security jointly with the Department of  
12 Education shall be responsible for the implementation of all actions related  
13 to this bill.

14 A) Teachers must be trained extensively and have had appropriate  
15 background checks.

16 B) If a teacher violates any firearm regulations he/she shall face  
17 federal punishment.

18 Article V: All other laws that are in conflict with this bill shall hereby be declared  
19 null and void.

**A Bill to Cease Production of the Penny**

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here  
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: The United States Mint shall cease production of the penny at all locations  
4 that currently produce the penny.

5 Article II: The term “penny” shall be defined as any coinage that is worth one cent.

6 Article III: Six months after the passage of this legislation, production of the penny  
7 shall be reduced to fifty percent of its current production. Twelve months  
8 after passage, production shall be reduced to seventy-five percent of its  
9 current production. Twenty-four months after passage, the production of  
10 the penny shall cease

11 Article IV: The United States Federal Reserve and their corresponding minters shall  
12 be responsible for enforcing this bill.

13 A) The current production cost of the penny exists at 1.66 cents to 1  
14 penny.

15 B) All wholesales using United States currency: shall be forced to  
16 round to the nearest nickel value. Online currency or  
17 cryptocurrency may maintain their original values.

18 C) All pennies that remain in circulation may be used as equivalent  
19 currency.

20 Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation shall be declared null and void.

**A Bill to Mandate the Release of Video Footage Involving Law Enforcement Officers**

1 Be it enacted by this student congress here assembled that:

2 Article 1. A. In all cases where a law enforcement officer is involved in an  
3 incident involving the discharge of firearms which results in the  
4 injury or death of a suspect, all unedited video footage of the  
5 incident must be turned over to the Department of Justice within  
6 24 hours.

7 B. All such footage must also be made available to any interested  
8 media outlets within 72 hours after the incident.

9 Article 2. A. “Video footage” is dashboard cameras, body cameras, helicopter  
10 cameras, drone videos, embedded media sources, or any other  
11 means of recording the incident which are controlled and held by  
12 the law enforcement agency.

13 B. A “law enforcement officer” is a government employee who is  
14 responsible for the prevention, investigation, apprehension, or  
15 detention of individuals suspected or convicted of offenses.

16 Article 3. This shall take effect on January 1, 2018.

17 Article 4. The Department of Justice will oversee enforcement of this legislation,  
18 and will examine video footage turned over to determine if the civil rights  
19 of the victim were violated during the incident.

20 Article 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void

**A Bill to Lower the Schedule of LSD**

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here  
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: The United States government shall lower the schedule of Lysergic Acid  
4 Diethylamide (LSD) to allow for more medical testing on the use of LSD  
5 as a pharmaceutical drug.

6 Article II: Schedule shall be defined as the rank, 1-5, given to drugs by the Drug  
7 Enforcement Agency based on how addictive or harmful a drug is.

8 Medical testing shall be defined as any testing done to determine the  
9 safety or effectiveness of a drug on humans.

10 Article III: This legislation shall be implemented January 1st, 2019.

11 Article IV: The United States Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) shall oversee  
12 the implementation of this legislation.

13 A) The DEA shall lower LSD from a schedule 1 to a schedule 2  
14 ranking.

15 Article V: All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be  
16 declared null and void.

**A Bill to Require the Presence of Law Enforcement on all Public K-12 School Campuses**

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here  
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: Every K-12 public school - in addition to already established security  
4 precautions - must have two local law enforcement officers on campus  
5 patrolling during school hours in order to deter potential harm to students.  
6 If the school already has two or more law enforcement officers on campus,  
7 they have met the requirement.

8 Article II: “Weaponized acts” will be defined as violent acts that inflict damage  
9 through the use of items with the sole purpose of causing physical harm to  
10 others, such as firearms.

11 Article III: This bill will go into effect at the beginning of the 2019-2020 school year,  
12 depending on various county dates across the country.

13 Article IV: The Department of Education and local law enforcement agencies will  
14 work in conjunction to implement this legislation.

15 Article V: All other laws that are in conflict with this bill shall hereby be declared  
16 null and void.

**A Bill to Update United States Emergency Call Centers**

1 Be it enacted by this Florida Forensic League Student Congress here assembled that:

2 Article I: Emergency call centers shall receive additional funding to improve  
3 location and communication technology to now receive information from  
4 all smart phone calls and allow texting options in emergency situations.

5 Article II: Emergency call centers shall also receive additional funding to help with  
6 understaffing issues at the call centers. Emergency call centers, also  
7 referred to as “911 dispatch centers”, shall be defined as centers that  
8 provide callers advise in handling critical situations via phones until police  
9 or fire personnel arrive to provide direct assistance.

10 Article III: This legislation shall be implemented at the beginning at the fiscal year  
11 2019.

12 Article IV: The Federal Communications Bureau will be responsible for the  
13 implementation of this legislation.

14 Article V: All laws in conflict with the passage of this legislation shall be declared  
15 null and void.

**The Clean Water Act of 2018**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Article 1. A. \$400 billion will be invested to improving the nation’s drinking  
3 water infrastructure.

4 B. Chromium 6 will be capped at 0.06 parts per billion.

5 Article 2. Drinking water infrastructure includes the physical components that  
6 comprise a water utility’s source of supply, treatment, storage,  
7 transmission and distribution systems.

8 Article 3. The funding will be delivered within 3 months of the passage of this bill.

9 Article 4. The money will go to the Environmental Protection Agency to fund  
10 construction projects regarding drinking water and wastewater systems, as  
11 well as, enforcing the regulations for Chromium 6.

12 Article 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
