

A Bill to Designate the Muslim Brotherhood a Foreign Terrorist Organization

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: Under Section 219 of the Immigration and Nationality Act, the Society
4 of Muslim Brothers will be designated a Foreign Terrorist Organization.

5 Article II: “The Society of Muslim Brothers” will be defined according to the
6 Muslim Brotherhood Terrorist Designation Act of 2015. A “Foreign
7 Terrorist Organization” will be defined according to Section 219 of the
8 Immigration and Nationality Act and must be a foreign organization,
9 engage in terrorist activity or retain the capability and intent to engage in
10 terrorist activity, and threaten the security of U.S. nationals or the national
11 security of the United States.

12 Article III: This legislation will go into effect seven days after passage.

13 Article IV: The U.S. Department of State will oversee the implementation and
14 enforcement of this legislation.

15 Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation and hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Furlough Congressional Salaries During Government Shutdowns

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: This bill will call for congressional salaries to be furloughed for the
4 duration of government shutdowns.

5 Article II: A) Furlough will be defined as the withholding of salary (not
6 benefits).

7 B) Congressional Salaries will be defined as the salaries of the elected
8 persons in the House and Senate.

9 C) Government shutdowns will be defined as the period of time in
10 which the national government is not funded and non-essential
11 discretionary federal programs close.

12 Article III: Effective immediately following the declaration of a shutdown.

13 Article IV: The Treasury Department will be tasked with enforcing this bill.

14 Article V: All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be
15 declared null and void.

The Education Reform and Equality Act of 2019

1 Be it enacted by this PBCFL Student Congress here assembled that:

2 Article I: A. An additional \$10 billion shall be allocated proportionally to the
3 states for a K-12 School Voucher Program. An additional \$20
4 billion shall be allocated proportionally to the states for public
5 education in low income areas.

6 B. To receive funding, states must utilize the money to finance a
7 School Voucher Program, and must also utilize the other allocation
8 of funds for designing and funding programs that provide more
9 resources to school districts serving disadvantaged students.

10 Article II: “School Voucher Program” shall be defined as a program that makes state
11 funding available to families to send their children to private primary and
12 secondary educational institutions. “Public education in low income areas”
13 shall be defined as school districts that have at least 45% of students
14 qualifying for a free or reduced lunch program.

15 Article III: Funding shall be allocated on November 1st, 2020. States will elect
16 whether they wish to receive the funds by October 1, 2019.

17 Article IV: The Department of Education shall oversee the implementation of this
18 legislation. The funds shall be distributed to each state proportionally
19 depending on the number of residents living below the poverty line.

20 Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Prevent Government Shutdowns

1 Be it enacted by this PBCFL Student Congress here assembled that:

2 Article 1. In the event of an Annual Fiscal Budget not being passed by Congress and
3 signed by the President in time to meet the deadline the previous year's
4 budget will go back into effect.

5 Article 2. Annual Fiscal Budget shall be defined as the legislation assigning funding
6 to each federal department, with the monetary amount for each department
7 changing every year.

8 Article 3. This bill shall go into effect immediately.

9 Article 4. This bill will be enforced by the Office of Management and Budget in
10 conjunction with the Department of Treasury.

11 Article 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are null and void.

1 Be it enacted by this PBCFL Student Congress here assembled that:

2 Article I: The Consumer Product Safety Act shall be amended to include permanent
3 amusement park rides.

4 Article II: Amusement park rides shall be defined as any mechanical device which
5 carries or conveys passengers along, around, or over a fixed or restricted
6 route or course for the purpose of giving its passengers amusement,
7 pleasure, thrills, or excitement. "Amusement ride" shall also include the
8 business of operating water rides.

9 Article III: This legislation shall go into effect January 1, 2020.

10 Article IV: Mandatory safety standards will be created and regulated by the Consumer
11 Product Safety Commission.

12 Article V: All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be
13 declared null and void.

A Bill to Make the Roads a TAD Bit Safer

15 null and void.

8 responsible for implementation and oversight of this bill.

9 Article V: All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be
10 declared null and void.

A Bill to Fund CDC Research for Diseases Abroad

1 Article 1: The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention shall be given an
2 additional \$500 million annually towards researching and controlling new
3 diseases abroad within LEDCs.

4 Article 2: Researching shall be defined as investigating possible diseases that
5 originate from animals. Controlling shall be defined as actively preventing
6 any discovered diseases. New diseases abroad shall be defined as foreign
7 diseases outside of the United States. LEDCs shall be defined as a Less
8 Economically Developed Country, which includes countries with a lower
9 GDP and a lower standard of living than MEDCs, and generally includes
10 less industrial development and education.

11 Article 3: This law shall go into effect in the FY 2020.

12 Article 4: The Center for Disease Control and Prevention shall oversee the
13 implementation of this bill.

14 Article 5: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Prohibit Payment of Congressional Salaries During a Government Shutdown

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Article 1. If on any day during a pay period a Government shutdown is in effect, the
3 payroll administrator of each Chamber of Congress shall exclude from the
4 payments otherwise required to be made with respect to that pay period for
5 the compensation of each member of Congress who serves in that
6 Chamber of Congress an amount equal to one day's worth of pay under
7 the annual rate of pay applicable to the Member under section 601(a) of
8 the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946.

9 Article 2. A "Government shutdown" shall be considered to be in effect if there is a
10 lapse in appropriations for any Federal agency or department as a result of
11 a failure to enact a regular appropriations bill or continuing resolution. A
12 "payroll administrator" is the Chief Administrative Officer of the
13 Chamber. A "member of Congress" means an individual serving in a
14 position under subparagraph (A), (B), or (C) of section 601(a) of the
15 Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946.

16 Article 3. This legislation shall apply immediately upon passage.

17 Article 4. The Secretary of the Treasury shall provide the payroll administrators of
18 the chambers of Congress with such assistance as may be necessary to
19 enable the payroll administrators to carry out this section.

20 Article 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
