

## **A Bill to Make College Free**

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here  
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: A. Tuition at public universities and colleges shall be eliminated.

4 B. Funding shall be taken from a 0.5% tax on stock trades, a 0.1% tax  
5 on bonds, and a 0.005% tax on derivatives.

6 Article II: Public universities and colleges shall be defined as an institution of higher  
7 education above the secondary school level that is funded by public  
8 means.

9 Article III: This legislation shall be implemented at the start of fiscal year 2022.

10 Article IV: The Department of Education in conjunction with the US Securities and  
11 Exchange Commission (SEC) shall be in charge of implementation of this  
12 legislation.

13 Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation shall hereby be declared null and  
14 void.

**A Bill Encouraging Energy Efficient Housing to Help the Environment**

7 Article II: Energy efficient devices will be defined as anything that uses alternative  
8 energy sources such as solar panels or the use of new energy efficient

10 Article III: This bill will be implemented January 1, 2021.

11 Article IV: The government agency to oversee this bill is the IRS.

12 A) IRS will issue \$5,000 supplement in tax returns to each household.

13 Article V: All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall  
14 hereby be declared null and void.

## **A Bill to Establish an Emergency Federal Budget**

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here  
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: An emergency federal budget will be established in the event of a future  
4 government shutdown. This bill will support essential personnel through  
5 the shutdown time period by allocating \$3 billion, diverted from the U.S.  
6 Department of Defense budget.

7 Article II: “Essential personnel” are defined as those employees who must remain  
8 working without pay during the government shutdown. An “emergency  
9 federal budget” in this context is defined as monetary funds set aside for  
10 paycheck usage, rent assistance, and other programs to help sustain those  
11 employed by the government who must still report to work despite  
12 conditions of a government shutdown. A “government shutdown” occurs  
13 when Congress fails to pass sufficient appropriation bills or continuing  
14 resolutions to fund the federal government operations and agencies, or  
15 when the President vetoes such bills or resolutions.

16 Article III: This legislation will go into effect immediately upon passage.

17 Article IV: The Appropriations Committee of the House and the Office of  
18 Management and Budget will work in conjunction to oversee the budget  
19 upon passage of this legislation.

20 Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
