

A Bill to Incorporate Financial Literacy into High School Curriculum

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 SECTION 1. High schools will be required to incorporate a mandatory one-year
3 financial literacy course into the curriculum of high schools nationwide.
4 The financial literacy courses will discuss issues including (but not limited
5 to) student loans, personal accounting, debt management, taxes,
6 insurances, the creation of savings plans, strategic investment, and
7 budgeting. All students will be required to pass this course to graduate
8 from high school.

9 SECTION 2. Financial literacy is defined as the ability to understand how money
10 works: how someone makes, manages and invests it, and also expends it.

11 SECTION 3. The U.S. Department of Education will oversee the implementation of this
12 legislation.

13 SECTION 4. This legislation with be implemented at the beginning of the next fiscal
14 year.

15 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Introduced for Congressional Debate by Cardinal Newman High School

A Bill to Restore Democracy in Venezuela by Sending aid and Training Freedom Fighters

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Section 1. Former and present Venezuelan leaders have corrupted democracy in the
3 nation from their 20 years in power. The tyranny of these leaders is
4 creating increased economic chaos, public unrest, and violence within the
5 now socialist state. This bill allocates 720 million dollars from the
6 Department of Defense's budget, to work through non-governmental
7 organizations (NGO's) to provide the Venezuelan public basic food
8 resources, as well as related technical and military assistance.

9 Section 2. NGO's shall be defined as nonprofit organizations that operate
10 independently of any individual governments control, like Oxfam or
11 BRAC. Basic food resources shall be defined as simple, easily attainable
12 sources of nutrients. Technical and military assistance shall be defined as
13 civil engineers and special operations units that will work on Venezuela's
14 infrastructure and training freedom fighters.

15 Section 3. The Department of Defense will work in conjunction with the Bureau of
16 Democracy, Human Rights, and Labor to oversee enforcement of the bill,
17 but funding will come exclusively from the Department of Defense.

18 Section 4. This legislation will take effect in the fiscal year (FY) 2020.

19 Section 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

The Agricultural Welfare Act of 2019

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 SECTION 1. A. All federal farm subsidies shall be disbanded.

4 B. Farm subsidies funding shall be redirected to increase funding
5 towards the SNAP program.

6 SECTION 2. A. Subsidies shall be defined as any federal allocation or benefit of
7 money in any form for any program providing marketing loans or
8 agricultural disaster aid to individual farmers, to farm businesses or
9 corporations, or for agricultural and food research and
10 development programs.

11 B. SNAP shall be defined as a program providing aid to low income
12 individuals and families in order to buy food.

13. SECTION 3. The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) shall be responsible
14 for the overseeing and enforcing this bill.

15. SECTION 4. This bill shall be implemented October 1st, 2020.

16. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Promote Democracy in Venezuela

1 Be it enacted by this Student Congress here assembled that:

3 Section I: The United States shall fly in 500 million dollars of Humanitarian Aid to
4 Venezuela's Opposition Party, to ultimately reach the starving Venezuelan
5 citizens.

6 Section II: Opposition Party shall be defined as the Voluntad Popular Party led by
7 Juan Guaidó. Humanitarian Aid shall be defined as food, water, and
8 medicine.

9 Section III: USAID will work in conjunction with the United States Air Force in
10 delivering and organizing Humanitarian Aid.

11 Section IV: This legislation shall go into effect April 2nd 2019.

12 Section V: All laws in conflict with this legislation are null and void.

Introduced for Congressional Debate by FAU High School

**A Bill to Provide Humanitarian Assistance to Colombia and Brazil to Combat the South
American Refugee Crisis**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 SECTION 1. The United States shall invest one hundred (100) million dollars annually
3 towards humanitarian efforts in Colombia and Brazil that provide
4 humanitarian assistance to refugees of the Venezuelan political crisis.

5 SECTION 2. Humanitarian assistance includes but is not limited to basic necessities
6 such as food and water, housing, and legal services.

7 SECTION 3. The State Department in conjunction with the United States Agency for
8 International Development (USAID) shall be responsible for enforcing the
9 provisions of this legislation.

10 A. The provisions of this legislation shall be funded by a federal
11 excise tax that adds an additional \$.02 per carton of cigarettes sold.
12 If the necessity for humanitarian assistance expires, this tax can be
13 reallocated towards other USAID initiatives or eliminated all-
14 together.

15 B. USAID, on top of mandated agency reports, shall produce an
16 additional monthly report detailing the effectiveness of this aid and
17 will be responsible for making recommendations including
18 restricting aid or eliminating it all together.

19 SECTION 4. This legislation shall go into effect immediately upon passage.

20 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Aid Haiti

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 SECTION 1. A) The United States shall send 5 billion dollars in developmental
3 assistance to Haiti.

4 B) The United States shall work with government officials in Haiti to
5 reorganize the government and create anti-corruption policies.

6 SECTION 2. A) Developmental assistance shall be defined as aid going towards
7 food, water, medicine, and infrastructure.

8 B) Reorganizing the government shall be defined as strengthening
9 the rule of law and having more government transparency.

10 C) Anti-corruption policies shall be defined as policies preventing
11 bribery, fraud during elections, money laundering, etc.

12 SECTION 3. A) The United States Department of State shall be responsible for
13 implementation of this legislation.

14 B) The United States Department of State shall conduct yearly audits
15 for proper allocation of developmental assistance

16 SECTION 4. This legislation shall go into effect in the next fiscal year.

17 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Introduced for Congressional Debate by Royal Palm Beach High School

A Bill to Sanction Saudi Arabia

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Section 1: A. The United States will place strict targeted sanctions on Saudi
3 Arabia until the conflict in Yemen ends.

4 B. The United States will stop both arms sales and military aid to
5 Saudi Arabia.

6 Section 2. Arms sales shall be defined as the trade or exchange of militaristic
7 weaponry, ammunition, battle tanks, machine guns, and explosives.

8 Military aid is defined as tanks, planes, bombs, refueling planes, firearms,
9 or any device used by the military given by the United States. Targeted
10 Sanctions are defined as economic sanctions that specifically target the
11 Saudi government.

12 Section 3. The Department of Defense and The Department of State shall be
13 responsible for implementing and enforcing the provisions of this
14 legislation.

15 A. The Department of Defense shall end all military aid deals and
16 negotiations with Saudi Arabia.

17 B. The Department of State shall place targeted sanctions on Saudi Arabia.

18 Section 4. The provisions of this legislation shall be enforced on January 1st, 2020.

19 Section 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Introduced for Congressional Debate by Suncoast Community High School

A Bill to Ban Taxes on Feminine Hygiene Products

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 SECTION 1. All sales taxes placed on feminine hygiene products shall be lifted.

3 SECTION 2. Feminine hygiene products (also called menstrual hygiene products) are
4 personal care products used by women, for menstruation, vaginal
5 discharge, and other bodily functions related to the vulva and vagina.

6 SECTION 3. The United States Department of the Treasury will oversee the
7 enforcement of the bill along with the specific enforcement mechanism.

8 SECTION 4. This bill shall take effect in June of 2020.

9 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Introduced for Congressional Debate by Wellington High School

A Bill to Enact Term Limits on Both Houses of Congress

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 SECTION 1. There shall be mandatory term limits for both houses of Congress. These
3 limits shall be five (5) terms or ten (10) years for the House of
4 Representatives and two (2) terms or twelve (12) years for the Senate.
5 These terms may be served consecutively or separately. For existing
6 Representatives and Senators who have served more than the allotted
7 terms outlined in this bill, only one (1) additional term shall be allowed
8 before they are barred from further service.

9 SECTION 2. Term limit shall be defined as the maximum amount of time a citizen may
10 serve in a specific house of Congress.

11 SECTION 3. This law will be implemented and enforced by the United States House
12 Committee on House Administration in the House of Representatives and
13 the United States Senate Committee on Rules and Administration in the
14 Senate.

15 SECTION 4. This law shall take effect following the 2020 Election.

16 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
