

A Bill to Increase Implementation of Building Integrated Photovoltaics

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: In order to address growing carbon emissions and improve
4 the climate while effectively utilizing space, the United States shall begin
5 the process of implementing Building Integrated Photovoltaics onto
6 newly constructed buildings in order to reduce reliance on carbon emitting
7 energy sources.

8 Article II: Building Integrated Photovoltaics (BIPV) shall be defined as solar panels
9 part of a building's construction that generates clean energy.

10 Article III: This legislation will be enforced by The U.S. Department of Energy
a. The Department of Energy should allocate \$50 million yearly to fund the
implementation of Building Integrated Photovoltaics.
b. The allocation of these funds will be prioritized for large
corporations/manufactures consuming more than 65,000 kWh of energy
annually.

12 Article IV: This legislation will be go into effect January 1st, 2025

13 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall be null and void.

A Bill to Cap the Price of Pharmaceutical Drugs

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: The United States Government will have the power to determine the
4 market price of all pharmaceutical drugs by setting a price ceiling that all
5 domestic pharmaceutical companies must comply with.

6 Article II: Let the following definitions be used as interpretations:

7 Pharmaceuticals: any kind of drug used for medicinal purposes

8 Pharmaceutical Companies: a company that makes and sells
9 pharmaceutical drugs.

10 Price Ceiling: the mandated maximum amount a seller is allowed to
11 charge for a product or service.

12 Article III: The price ceiling will be established and regulated by Health and Human
13 Services (HHS). They will enforce this by having unilateral authority.

14 A) The Secretary of HHS will determine the prices through the drug's
15 value.

16 B) The pharmaceutical companies will have 2 years to meet the
17 adjusted prices through a step down process.

18 C) Companies that do not meet this deadline will face fines until they
19 reach the adjusted price requirement.

20 Article IV: This legislation will take effect immediately after passing.

21 Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to End Censuring in the Legislative Branch

1. Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2. assembled that:
3. Article I: In order to maintain consistency and eliminate inefficiency, be it that the
4. act of censuring shall be eliminated within the legislative branch on the
5. federal, state, and local levels of government.
6. Article II: The act of censuring shall be defined as a formal statement of disapproval
7. in the form of a resolution that is adopted by majority vote, incapable of
8. removing a senator from office or denying a senator his or her rights or
9. privileges.
10. Article III: The Department of State will oversee the implementation of this bill
11. within all levels of government.
12. Article IV: This bill will go into effect on January 31st, 2024
13. Article V: All other laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
14. void.

The Illegal Immigrant Deterrence Act

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress
2 here assembled that:

3 Article 1: The United States shall hereby aid in the removal of illegal
4 immigrants in the following ways:

5 A. 80 billion dollars shall be allocated to U.S. Border
6 Patrol (USBP) for the usage of improving the
7 border wall and improving their equipment.

13 years.

23 Article 3: The U.S. Department of Homeland Security shall oversee the
25 implementation and enforcement of this legislation.

26 Article 4: This bill will go into effect upon the date of February 1, 2024.

27 Article 5: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
28 and void.

A RESOLUTION TO IMPLEMENT A NATIONAL IDENTIFICATION CARD

1 Whereas: The Social Security Number (SSN) currently serves as a “de-facto”
2 method of identifying U.S Citizens for governmental and
3 non-governmental purposes; and
4 Whereas: The Social Security Administration states that the SSN was never intended
5 to be utilized as a national or unique identifier; and
6 Whereas: The SSN has been proven to be insecure and lacks and complex method
7 of assigning digits; and

9 security standards for both physical cards and assigned numerals; and
6 Whereas: The creation of a national identification card will replace the SNN for
7 identification purposes and follow REAL ID standards; and
10 Whereas: This Congress believes that U.S states and territories shall continue to be
11 responsible for issuing driver’s licenses.
12 Therefore, Be it resolved by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student
13 Congress assembled here that: A National Identification Card and Number
14 be created for the sole purpose of identification.

A Bill to End the Malicious Use of Artificial Intelligence

1 Be it here enacted by this student congress that:

2 Article 1. The use of artificial intelligence to mimic the voice of an individual shall
3 be forbidden unless written consent is given by an individual or their
4 estate.

5 a. Artificial intelligence shall not be used to mimic the voice of an
6 individual who is a legal minor.

7 b. The use of artificial intelligence to defame the character of an
8 individual shall carry the same penalty as defamation would in any
9 other instance.

10 Article 2. Artificial intelligence shall be defined as a machine-based system that uses
11 machine and human-based inputs to produce outputs in human-defined
12 parameters that include text, images, and audio. Mimicking, for the
13 purposes of this legislation, shall be defined as copying or imitating
14 speech in a manner that bears little to no difference to actual speech.

15 Article 3. This bill shall take effect on July1, 2024.

16 Article 4. The Federal Trade Commission shall be responsible for enforcing this
17 legislation.

18 Article 5: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall be null and void.
