A Bill to Repurpose Our Nuclear Waste

Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here assembled that

1	Article I:	The federal government will provide 50 billion dollars to create fast neutron
2		reactors and fund the conversion of nuclear waste to energy.
3	Article II:	Neutron reactors are defined as nuclear reactors with a neutron spectrum in their
4		core zone containing mainly neutrons with kinetic energies of the
5		MeV(Mega electron-volt). Nuclear waste can be defined as radioactive waste
6		material which can be yielded by nuclear power plants. A MeV is a measurement
7		of energy equivalent to one million times one electron volt
8	Article III:	This bill will be implemented by January 1st, 2024.
9	Article IV:	The implementation of this bill will be overseen by the United States Department
10		of Energy. Upon implementation, 40 billion dollars will be extracted from the
11		U.S. Treasury in order to manufacture the fast neutron reactors. The remaining
12		billion will be allocated gradually over the twenty years following
13		implementation, in 10 equal increments, to fund the maintenance of the reactors.
14		There will be a 1% tax on all non-renewable energy production for this twenty
15		year time span to offset the costs of initial manufacturing and subsequent
16		maintenance.
17	Article V:	All laws in conflict in this bill shall be declared null and void.
