

The Healthcare Reform Act of 2025

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: The United States shall hereby reform its healthcare system in the
4 following ways:

5 A. A public option healthcare system shall be established to increase
6 coverage.

7 B. \$1 billion dollars shall hereby be provided to rural areas to invest
8 in hospital and medical infrastructure,

9 Article II: A public option insurance program shall be defined as a government-run
10 Healthcare plan that would compete against private insurers in individual
11 market exchanges. Hospital and medical infrastructure will be defined as
12 any resource necessary to operate hospitals (i.e. medical personnel,
13 vehicles, buildings, medicines, and any other measures designed to bolster
14 healthcare accessibility.

15 Article III: This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2025.

16 Article IV: The United States Department of Health and Human Services shall be
17 tasked with the enforcement and oversight of this legislation.

18 A) A premium of \$200 per month shall be established for the public
19 options.

20 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall be null and void.

The VICE (Venezuela Illegal Cartel Eradication) Act

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress

2 here assembled that:

3 Article I: All Venezuelan companies known to partake and/or support in the
4 production, distribution, and trafficking of narcotics shall be sanctioned.

5 Article II: “Sanctions” shall be defined as a mechanism to financially punish an
6 entity for violating international law or the general order of peace and
7 stability and/or to coerce an entity into taking a specific action.

8 Article III: This bill will go into effect on January 1st, 2025.

9 Article IV: The United States Treasury in conjunction with the Office of Foreign
10 Assets Control and the Bureau of International Narcotics will oversee the
11 implementation and enforcement of this bill.

12 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby null
13 and void.

A Bill to Create Joint Trade and Company Ventures with Japan

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress

2 here assembled that:

3 Article I: The United States will foster joint company and trade ventures
4 with like-minded Japanese companies over the next 10 years to
5 foster a healthy and prosperous trade relationship, and to
6 promote new business ideas and technologies.

7 Article II: a) company and trade ventures will be defined as US and
8 Japanese companies prioritizing working on projects and
9 trading resources with each other.

10 b) like-minded companies will be defined as companies that
11 practice similarly in related fields.

12 Article III: This bill will go into effect in the first month of the year 2025

13 Article IV: The Department of Commerce (DOC) will oversee the
14 implementation and enforcement of this bill.

15 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall be null and
16 void.

A Bill to Ensure Freedom, Democracy, and Security in Taiwan

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article 1 The United States shall

4 A. Formally recognize the Republic of China (Taiwan) as a sovereign
5 nation;

6 B. Establish a military base in Taiwan; C. Deploy 10,000 American
7 troops to be stationed in Taiwan.

8 Article 2 "Military base" is hereby defined as a permanent facility built to house US
9 troops and military equipment for sustained operations. This can include
10 airfields, barracks, garrisons, navy bases, radar stations, and other
11 infrastructure. "Taiwan" is hereby defined, for the purposes of this bill, as
12 the island of Taiwan and 167 outlying islands under the control of the
13 Republic of China.

14 Article 3 The Department of Defense will oversee the implementation of this bill.

15 A. The US Department of State shall draft a Status of Forces
16 Agreement for ratification by the US Senate and the Taiwanese
17 Legislative Yuan. If the agreement is not mutually ratified within
18 two (2) years, no action will be taken under this bill.

19 B. The US Army Corps of Engineers will estimate the costs of
20 constructing and operating new bases and shall report these costs
21 to Congress by the beginning of FY 2025. These costs will be met
22 through future National Defense Authorization Acts.

23 Article 4 This bill shall take effect upon passage.

24 Article 5 All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Legalize Private Sale of Human Organs

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: Sale of human organs by their owner to consumers will now be legal

4 Article II: Human Organs is defined as, “a group of tissues in a living organism that
5 have been adapted to perform a specific function.”

6 Article III: Any 25 year old human may elect to sell their organs to a willing
7 purchaser as long as it meets the following requirements:

8 A. The organ cannot be one whose absence causes direct death

9 B. All sales must be overseen and approved by a new executive
10 agency with screenings for any physical, mental, or genetic condi
11 tions that may alter the quality or organs or create a lack of com
12 plete consent

13 C. Each US State will receive categorial grants of 5 million dollars
14 per year to establish satellite outposts in their state to process re
15 quests

16 The Congress will appropriate 150 million dollars for the creation of “The
17 US Department of Organ Sales.”

18 The penalty for unregistered sale of organs will be classified as a human
19 trafficking crime, with a mandatory minimum prison sentence of 20 years

20 Article IV: The US Department of Organ Sales will oversee the enforcement of this
21 legislation. This legislation will go into effect January 20th 2025

22 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall be null and void.

A Bill to Prevent Urban Sprawl

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Congress that:

2 Article I: The US Government will establish urban growth boundaries to limit
3 urban sprawl. The size of these boundaries will be based on the
4 proportion of the county population according to 3 classes.

5 A) Class 1: 10 or less people per square mile indicates 80% of land
6 must be protected by the county.

7 B) Class 2: 50-200 people per square mile indicates 50% of land
8 protected.

9 C) Class 3: 200+ people per square mile indicates 10% of land
10 protected.

11 Article II: An Urban growth boundary shall be defined as a boundary that separates
12 urban areas from the surrounding natural and agricultural lands. Urban
13 sprawl shall be defined as unrestricted growth in many urban areas of
14 housing, commercial development, and roads over large expanses of land.

15 Article III: This bill shall go in effect on January 1st, 2026.

16 Article IV: A. This legislation shall be enforced by local county governments.

17 B. The United States Department of Agriculture and the Department of
18 the Interior shall oversee the implementation of this legislation.

19 Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Allocate Funding for Pre-Secondary Athletic Departments

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: Athletic departments in pre-secondary level education have been
4 heavily underfunded, taking away from the opportunities of students to
5 better themselves physically and mentally. Hence, this bill will allocate
6 funding for schools from property taxes as a means to allow each school
7 to have equal opportunity. 10% of all property taxes collected shall be
8 delivered to the State Boards of Education, which will then equally
9 distribute these funds to all public pre-secondary institutions for the
10 exclusive use of funding athletic programs.

11 Article II: Pre-secondary education shall be defined as the primary, intermediate and
12 high school levels of education.

13 Property tax is largely utilized to fund schools. Hence, the property tax
14 collected by the state should equally, in percentage, go to each school to
15 guarantee equal opportunities.

16 Article III: This bill will become effective January 1, 2025.

17 Article IV: The Department of Education will oversee the equal distribution of funds.

18 Article V: All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be
19 declared null and void.

A Bill to Defund Public Libraries that Censor Books

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: Congress shall cease the funding of any library that is open to the public
4 and receives federal funding that practices book and online resource
5 censorship.

6 Article II: Censorship shall be defined as the removal of books from public access
7 on the basis that the content is related to race, religion, gender identity,
8 sexual orientation or sexual identity.

9 Article III: This bill shall go into effect on January 25, 2024.

10 Article IV: This bill shall be enforced by the United States Government Publishing
11 Office.

12 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this bill shall be null and void.

A Bill to Grant Released Felons the Right to Vote

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: Those with felony convictions shall be granted the right to vote after their
4 sentence has been served, thus eliminating the disenfranchisement of these
5 individuals.

6 Article II: A felony conviction shall be defined as any offense punishable by
7 imprisonment for more than one year. Disenfranchisement shall be defined
8 as being deprived of the right to vote.

9 Article III: This bill will become effective immediately upon passage.

10 Article IV: The Federal Elections Commission and the United States Department of
11 Treasury shall work alongside state and local governments to oversee the
12 passing of this
13 legislation.

14 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall be null and void.

A Bill to Support Policing in Small Towns

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: \$125 million shall be allocated to help establish and support police
4 departments in small towns. This money will go towards establishing or
5 maintaining local police departments in small towns lacking sufficient
6 police resources.

7 Article II: A “small town” is defined as an area with a population of 2,500 or fewer,
8 and is more than 20 miles from any incorporated municipality. “Lacking
9 sufficient police resources” is defined as any Law Enforcement Agency
10 with insufficient funding, resources, or personnel to adequately handle
11 crime that occurs in their jurisdiction.

12 Article III: This bill shall go into effect July 1, 2024

13 Article IV: The Department of Justice shall be tasked with enforcing this bill

14 a) The Department of Justice shall create a board that will be
15 tasked with reviewing crime statistics and extending
16 funding offers to small towns.

17 b) Small Towns may file a request for funds via the
18 Department of Justice’s board.

19 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall be null and void.
