

A Bill to Fund the IRS to Improve Equality

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: A. The United States will allocate five billion dollars to the budget of the
4 International Revenue Service (IRS) annually for the next ten years.
5 B. 1.5 billion dollars annually will be allocated to the Large Business &
6 International (LB&I) Division, and 2 billion dollars annually will be
7 allocated specifically to the IRS' Global High Wealth Industry Group
8 (GHW). The remaining 1.5 billion dollars will serve as a general fund for
9 the IRS.

10 Article II: A. The Large Business & International (LB&I) Division shall be defined
11 as a division of the IRS responsible for auditing domestic and international
12 businesses with assets equal to or exceeding ten million dollars.

13 B. The Global High Wealth Industry Group (GHW) shall be defined as a
14 task force created by the IRS, under the administration of the LB&I,
15 responsible for auditing individuals with assets or earnings in the tens of
16 millions of dollars.

17 C. A 'general fund' shall be defined as a collection of money, allocated to
18 a government entity, which can be used for anything so long as it helps
19 fulfill the mission of the entity.

20 Article III: This legislation will take effect October 1st, 2022.

21 Article IV: A. The Department of Treasury shall be in charge of the oversight of this
22 legislation.

23 B. Funds will be taken from the budget of the Department of Defense.

Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall be null and void.

A Bill to Quell Conflict in Kashmir

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: The United States shall send India and Pakistan an additional \$500 million
4 in developmental aid each.

5 Article II: Developmental aid shall be defined as “monetary assistance in the form of
6 direct grants, programs and/or training to support a developing country’s
7 political, social or economic development.”

8 Article III: This legislation will take effect on February 1, 2022

9 Article IV: The U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) shall be tasked
10 with the implementation of this legislation.

11 A. In order to continue receiving aid, both countries must withdraw their
12 military forces from Kashmir by February 1, 2022

13 B. Monthly audits will be conducted to ensure that both countries remain
14 in compliance with Article IV, Subsection A of this legislation.

15 C. If these audits determine that either India or Pakistan return military
16 forces to Kashmir, all U.S. Aid (military, developmental, humanitarian,
17 etc.) to the non-compliant country will cease immediately.

18 Article V: All laws in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be declared null and
19 void.

A Bill to Reinstate the Trans-Alaska Pipeline

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: The use and development of the Trans-Alaska Pipeline System, TAPS,
4 will be reinstated for the purpose of increasing the United States' self-
5 reliance on energy and creating job growth in rural Alaskan communities.

6 Article II: TAPS is one of the world's largest private oil transportation pipeline
7 systems.

8 Article III: This bill will go into effect at the beginning of the next fiscal year.

9 Article IV: The Department of Energy and The Bureau of Land Management will be
10 in charge of overseeing Exxon's management of the pipeline.

11 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall be null and void.

8 Services in combination with the department of education

9 Article IV: The implementation of this bill will be on January 2025

10 Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Allow Immunity Cards in Place of Vaccination Card.

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: Proof of Antibody levels may be used in place of vaccine cards for
4 individuals who have recovered from Covid and/or are otherwise unable to
5 get the vaccine.

6 Article II: A. Antibody or serology levels will be determined through a cPass SARS-
7 CoV-Neutralization Antibody Detection Kit.

8 B. Acceptable levels of IgM and IgG antibodies must be shown
9 up to six months from date of card.

10 C. "Unable to get the vaccine" include people previously exposed to
11 COVID and within the months that are discouraged from vaccine, those
12 with religious exemptions, and those who are immunocompromised.

13 Article III: This legislation will be enacted in January, 2022

14 Article IV: The Center for Disease Control, along with the Food and Drug
15 Administration, will be in charge of implementation

16 Article V: All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be 17
declared null and void.

A Resolution to Implement Mandatory Holocaust Education in Public Schools

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Whereas: Holocaust education has been greatly dismissed in most public schools,
4 leading to negligence about Holocaust origins and survivors; and

5 Whereas: Anti-Semitism is on the rise in America; and

6 Whereas: Holocaust education is essential to provide students with this knowledge
7 in order to help them make informed choices as citizens and to help root
8 out despicable acts of hatred, anti-Semitism, and other forms of prejudice
9 leading to historical negationism; and

10 Whereas: There has been continuous erasure of the Holocaust, and a majority of
11 Holocaust survivors are no longer living or are not able to share their
12 stories

13 Therefore, be it resolved by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student
14 Congress assembled here that mandatory Holocaust education shall be
15 implemented in all public schools within the United States.

A Bill to Enact the Federal American Arms Act

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: The act of constitutional open carry for firearms in the U.S. shall be
4 Federally legal, unfringed, and mandated for all states to adhere to.

5 Article II: Constitutional open carry is defined as the unhindered ability for
6 Americans to openly possess owned firearms without requiring a permit.

7 Article III: This legislation is to be rendered effective one month following its
8 passage.

9 Article IV: The enforcement of this legislation will be left to local and state
10 officials with the responsibility of overseeing this enforcement being left
11 to Federal authorities.

12 A) This bill will maintain the Federal legal age to own and carry
13 firearms as 18; it will require all U.S. states and territories to abide by
14 the Federal Regulations hereby enumerated. Current legal requirements to
15 own, purchase, and carry firearms such as criminal record, waiting
16 periods, and backgrounds shall not be impacted.

17 B) This bill is to be enacted and enforced in all U.S. states and
18 permanently inhabited territories under U.S. federal law.

19 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall be null and void.

A Bill to Implement Advisory Labels on Carbonated and Sugary Beverages

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: Any carbonated or sugary beverage exceeding levels of sugar appropriate
4 for consumption shall now receive an evident warning label serving to
5 educate the public.

6 Article II: A) The warning label should stand out against the traditional packaging
7 and be at the very least cover 2% of the original packaging's surface area.

8 B) Carbonated or sugary beverages are classified by the comprehensive
9 list provided by the United States Food & Drug Administration (FDA).

10 Article III: This bill shall be implemented in the fiscal year January, 2023.

11 Article IV: The United States Food and Drug Administration shall be tasked
12 with the enforcement of this legislation.

13 Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
14 void.

A Bill to Abolish Plea Bargains

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: The plea bargain shall be eliminated in US criminal courts, in order to
4 restore respect for the criminal justice system.

5 Article II: The plea bargain shall be defined as an arrangement between a prosecutor
6 and defendant, whereby the defendant pleads guilty to a lesser charge in
7 exchange for a more lenient sentence or an agreement to drop other
8 charges.

9 Article III: This bill shall be implemented by January 1st, 2022.

10 Article IV: The US Department of Justice will oversee the enforcement of the bill.

11 A) Diversion programs shall be implemented as an alternative, in
12 order to remove less serious criminal matters from the full, formal
13 procedures of the justice system.

14 B) A diversion program shall be defined as a form of pretrial
15 sentencing, in which a criminal offender joins rehabilitation
16 programs in order to resolve the behavior leading to the original
17 arrest.

18 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall be null and void.

**A Bill to Allocate Federal Funds on a Merit Based System to High School Athletic
Programs**

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: Under this legislation, federal funding for high school athletic programs
4 will be awarded based on a merit system. This system will award funding
5 based on a bracket related to the school's percentile ranking of all state
6 teams.

7 Article II: Teams which are ranked above the 90th percentile will receive up to
8 \$10,000 in federal funding, teams ranked in the 75th to 90th percentile
9 will receive up to \$8000 in funding, teams ranked in the 50th to 75th
10 percentile will receive up to \$6000 in funding, teams ranked in the 25th to
11 50th percentile will receive up to \$4500 in funding, and teams ranked
12 below the 25th percentile will receive up to \$3000 in funding.

13 Article III: The implementation of this legislation will be August 1st, 2023.

14 Article IV: The Department of Education shall be in charge of overseeing the
15 implementation of this bill.

16 Article V: All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be
17 declared null and void.

A Bill to Increase Military Presence in the South China Sea

3 Article I: The United States shall create a military base in Taiwan to curb Chinese

6 shall be defined as a facility directly owned and operated by the military
7 in order to store equipment, troops, and facilitate training exercises.

8 Article III: The U.S. Department of Defense shall oversee the enforcement of
9 this bill.

10 Article IV: This bill shall be implemented in FY 2022.

11 Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
12. void.

A Bill to Rebuild America

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic forensic league student Congress here
2 assembled that

3 Article I: 150 Billion US Dollars will be allocated to improve America's
4 infrastructure system

5 Article II: A. "Infrastructure" will be defined as public Aviation, Bridges, Dams,
6 Drinking Water systems, Energy systems, Hazardous Waste
7 systems, Inland Waterways, Levees, Parks and Recreation, Rail
8 Roads, Roads, Schools, Solid Waste systems, and Transit and
9 Wastewater systems.

10 B. "Improvements" will be such that the quality of the infrastructure
11 system in America must receive at least a one letter grade
12 improvement on the average as rated by the American Society for
13 Civil Engineers. The Institute for Sustainable Infrastructure must
14 also approve the individual projects.

15 Article III: This law will take effect within six months of passage.

16 Article IV: The Department of Transportation, Institute for Sustainable Infrastructure,
17 and the American Society for Civil Engineers will oversee implementation
18 of this bill.

19 Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Replace Physical Education with a Medical Emergencies Course as a Graduation Requirement

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: The U.S. government shall require state governments to replace physical
4 education graduation requirements with medical emergency courses.

5 Article II: Medical Emergency Courses will be defined as courses taken in CPR,
6 Toxicology, and Wilderness. These courses will educate students on
7 performing high quality CPR, identifying abuse of toxicologic ingestion
8 and help stabilize said persons, and identifying symptoms of common
9 environmental emergencies (i.e. hypothermia, lightning strike, drowning,
10 etc.).

11 Article III: This legislation shall be implemented by September 1st, 2022

12 Article IV: The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services will oversee the
13 implementation of this legislation.

14 A) States must follow the resuscitation guidelines provided by the
15 International Liaison Committee on Resuscitation (ILCOR).

16 B) The USDHHS will work with NGOs to develop a curriculum

17 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this legislation shall be null and void.
