

## **The FUTURE (Fair and Unified Transformation of U.S. Residency and Entry) Act of 2025**

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here  
2 assembled that:

3 Article I. The United States shall substantially increase investment in the  
4 immigration system to expedite the immigration process and curb the crisis at the border.

5 Article II. A) 20 billion dollars shall be provided to the U.S. Citizenship and  
6 Immigration Services (USCIS) and U.S. Customs and Border  
7 Protection (CBP) each towards hiring additional immigration  
8 judges and border patrol agents.

9 B) The cap for both family-based visas and employment-based visas  
10 shall both be increased by 150,000 issued each year.

11 C) Any immigrant with a bachelor's degree shall be eligible to apply  
12 for entry under a streamlined immigration process; immigrants on  
13 student-based visas shall be able to stay after the visa expires.

14 D) 10 billion dollars shall be allocated for resettlement programs  
15 designed to relocate newly arrived immigrants across multiple  
16 cities and states. These programs will provide housing, language  
17 training, and employment assistance, and be administered through  
18 USCIS in coordination with local governments and NGOs.

19 Article III. This legislation will take effect on July 1st, 2025.

20 Article IV. The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) in conjunction with the  
21 Department of Justice (DOJ) shall be responsible for the implementation  
22 of this bill.

23 Article V. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# A Bill to Establish Inclusive Bathrooms for Transgender Individuals

*Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here assembled that:*

1.     **Article I:**       The United States government shall mandate the creation of
2.                       inclusive bath facilities that are accessible to individuals regardless of gender
3.                       identity in all federal buildings and public spaces.
4.     **Article II:**     **Inclusive bathrooms** are defined as facilities that are designated for use by all
5.                       individuals, irrespective of their gender identity, and are equipped with privacy
6.                       features that ensure safety and comfort.
7.     **Article III:**    The bill will take effect in FY 2025.
8.     **Article IV:**    The General Services Administration (GSA) shall oversee the implementation
9.                       and compliance of this legislation within federal buildings, while state and local
10.                      Governments shall be responsible for enforcement in public spaces.
11.    **Article V:**     All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be
12.                       declared null and void.

## **A Bill to Eliminate the Pink Tax**

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here

2 assembled that:

3 Article I: The purpose of this bill is to eradicate the discriminatory price increase in  
4 products designed to be used by biologically female citizens in the U.S.

5 Article II: A) Menstrual: Relating to the menses or menstruation.

6 B) Products: An article or substance that is manufactured or refined for sale.

7 C) Pink Tax: Gender-based price disparities

8 Article III: The implementation of this bill shall take place in November 2025.

9 Article IV: The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) will oversee the implementation of  
10 this bill.

11 A) This bill prohibits any person from selling (or offering to sell) nearly  
12 identical consumer products or services at different prices based on the  
13 gender of the intended buyer. For instance, if the only distinction  
14 between two products is their color, they are considered substantially  
15 similar.

15 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall be null and void.

# A Bill to Abolish the Pink Tax to Ensure Gender Pricing Parity

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2. **SECTION 1.** The Pink Tax is hereby abolished, prohibiting any form of  
3 gender-based pricing discrimination for products and  
4 services.

5. **SECTION 2.** “Pink Tax” is defined as the practice of charging different  
6 prices for products or services that are essentially the  
7 same but are marketed towards different genders.

8 A. **Gender Based Pricing Discrimination:** The act of pricing  
9 goods or services differently based solely on the targeted  
10 gender of the consumer.

11 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Consumer Affairs will conduct regular audits  
12 and inspections of retailers and service providers.

13 A. Consumers can file complaints regarding violations, which  
14 the Department will investigate.

15 B. Persistent violators may face additional sanctions,  
16 including suspension of business licenses.

17. **SECTION 4.** This Bill will be implemented January 1st 2026

18. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null  
19 and void.

## **A Bill to Legalize Private Sale of Human Organs**

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here

2 assembled that:

3 Article I: Sale of human organs by their owner to consumers will now be legal

4 Article II: Human Organs is defined as, “a group of tissues in a living organism that  
5 have been adapted to perform a specific function.”

6 Article III: Any 25 year old human may elect to sell their organs to a willing  
7 purchaser as long as it meets the following requirements:

8 A. The organ cannot be one whose absence causes direct death

9 B. All sales must be overseen and approved by a new executive  
10 agency with screenings for any physical, mental, or genetic condi-  
11 tions that may alter the quality of organs or create a lack of com-  
12 plete consent

13 C. Each US State will receive categorial grants of 5 million dollars  
14 per year to establish satellite outposts in their state to process re-  
15 quests

16 The Congress will appropriate 150 million dollars for the creation of  
17 “The US Department of Organ Sales.”

18 The penalty for unregistered sale of organs will be classified as a human  
19 trafficking crime, with a mandatory minimum prison sentence of 20 years

20 Article IV: The US Department of Organ Sales will oversee the enforcement of this  
21 legislation. This legislation will go into effect January 20<sup>th</sup> 2025

22 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall be null and void.

**The Prison Reform Initiative for New Growth in Learning & Education Support Act  
(P.R.I.N.G.L.E.S.)**

1      Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here  
2      assembled that:

3      **Article I:**      Increased funding will be provided to prison education systems in order to  
4                           improve the quality of these programs. Funding shall be allocated from a  
5                           10% tax on chips.

6      **Article II:**      “Prison education systems” are defined as any educational activity that  
7                           occurs inside prison. “Chips” can be defined as any brand of potato or  
8                           corn-derived chip that contains more or equal to 10 grams of fat per  
9                           serving.

10     **Article III:**    This legislation will go into effect in fiscal year 2026.

11     **Article IV:**    The Department of Justice shall oversee the implementation of this  
12                           legislation  
13                           and will be tasked with establishing a committee to ensure that funding is  
14                           used and distributed adequately.

15     **Article V:**      All laws in conflict with this legislation shall be declared null and void.

# **A Bill to Increase Affordable Housing Development**

1 Be it enacted by the Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here  
2 assembled that:

3 Article I The Department Of Defense (dod) shall allocate \$2 billion annually to fund  
4 grants and federal incentives aimed at increasing affordable housing  
5 development. This initiative is essential to address the growing housing  
6 crisis, ensure economic stability, and improve the quality of life for low-  
7 and moderate-income families.

8 Article II For the purposes of this legislation:  
9 “affordable housing” shall be defined as housing units that are affordable to  
10 those earning less than 80% of the area median income.  
11 “grants and federal incentives” shall include direct financial assistance, tax  
12 credits, and low-interest loans.

13 Article III The Department of Housing And Urban Development (HUD) will oversee  
14 the enforcement of this policy. HUD shall:  
15 Administer the distribution of funds through competitive grants.  
16 Monitor and report on the effectiveness of funded projects.  
17 Collaborate with state and local governments to ensure compliance and  
18 maximize impact.  
19 Audits and check-ins are conducted every 12 months to ensure proper use of  
20 funds and project progress.

21 Article IV This legislation will take effect in FY2025.

22 Article V All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Bill to Cap Childbirth Prices In Hospitals In the U.S.

*Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here assembled that:*

**Article I:** All hospitals in the United States shall be reformed to not exceed the total cost of \$10,000 per insured and uninsured person for childbirth.

**Article II:** Hospitals are defined as licensed institutions with at least six beds whose primary function is to provide diagnostic and therapeutic patient services for medical conditions.

An insured individual is defined as a person or legal entity whose financial losses are covered by the insurance policy. Under general and health insurance policies the insured is entitled to receive the benefit amount from the insurer for the covered financial loss.

An uninsured individual is defined as a person who does not have coverage under private health insurance, or any state or federal sponsored health plan or program.

Childbirth, in this context, is defined as the process of delivering a baby including natural, epidural, c-sections, and all other processes required to give birth. This policy shall be confined to the actual birthing process, excluding pre or post procedure.

**Article III:** This legislation will become effective beginning the fiscal year 2026.

**Article IV:** The U.S. The Department of Health shall oversee the implementation of this legislation.

**Article V:** All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be declared null and void.

## **A Bill to Ban Computer-Generated Learning Platforms**

1 Be it enacted by the Palm Beachy Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here  
2 assembled that:

3 ARTICLE I. In order to address a lack of human oversight in education and  
4 discrepancies in virtually taught material, all computer-generated learning  
5 platforms will be banned from use in the public education system.

6 ARTICLE II. Let the following definitions be used as interpretations:  
7 Computer-generated learning platforms are defined as collaborative  
8 learning programs located solely online virtually that aim to adapt to  
9 students' progress and teach subjects traditionally taught in school.  
10 Examples include: DeltaMath, IXL Learning, 360Learning, and SAVVAS  
11 Realize.

12 ARTICLE III. The Department of Education shall oversee enforcement. Computer  
13 generated virtual learning platforms must refund the full sum of the  
14 public schools' money invested in the platform once passed.

15 ARTICLE IV. This legislation will take effect immediately after passing.

16 ARTICLE V. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

**A Bill to Reform  
Private Troubled Teen Facilities**

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here  
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: The federal government will take measures to reform private Troubled  
4 Teen Facilities

5 Article II: Private is defined as any facility that is not publicly funded including  
6 companies, nonprofits, or faith-based groups.  
7 Troubled Teen Facilities are institutions that treat teenagers with  
8 behavioral, emotional, substance use problems, and cognitive and learning  
9 disabilities. These institutions are often unregulated and abusive.

10 Article III: This legislation will be enacted November 1, 2026.

11 Article IV: The U.S. Department of Commerce and Administration for Children and  
12 Families will oversee the enforcement of this bill.

13 A) The U.S. Department of Commerce will provide \$1 million to each  
14 state to create reporting systems for abuse incidents and establish  
15 best practices for staff training at these facilities.

16 B) The Administration for Children and Families will set specific  
17 health and safety standards for these institutions that are in line  
18 with public facilities.

19 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall be null and void.

## **A Bill To Aid the Central American Northern Triangle**

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here  
2 assembled that:

3 **Article I:** The United States of America shall allocate \$1 billion to reopening the  
4 Alliance for Prosperity. The results from the first year will determine  
5 contribution in future years.

6 **Article II:** The Alliance for Prosperity is a program that gives financial assistance to  
7 Central America's Northern Triangle (consisting of Guatemala, Honduras, &  
8 El Salvador), while requiring that each country pledges their their own  
9 domestic resources. The alliance focuses on improving well-being through  
10 job creation, food programs, stopping crime, reducing corruption, and more,  
11 with the underlying goal of reducing immigration to the US.

12 **Article III:** This bill shall be implemented in the fiscal year 2025.

13 **Article IV:** The United States Office of Foreign Assistance will enforce this legislation.

14 **Article V:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## **A Bill to Ban The Pink Tax**

8 menstruation.

10 ARTICLE 3. This bill shall take effect January 1, 2025.

11 ARTICLE 4. The United States Department of the Treasury will oversee the  
12 enforcement of the bill, along with the specific enforcement mechanism.

13 ARTICLE 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## **A Bill to Ban Unpaid Internships**

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here  
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: The Fair Labor Standards Act (29 USC 201-209) shall be amended by  
4 adding the following to section 206 part (b)(i), "...which includes all labor,  
5 regardless of primary beneficiary status."

6 Article II: All definitions shall be as listed in 29 USC 203, with the addition of the  
7 verbiage, "Primary beneficiary status shall be defined as the party by  
8 which the employment benefits greatest."

9 Article III: This bill shall be implemented on January 1, 2025.

10 Article IV: Any and all agencies tasked with the original implementation of the  
11 Fair Labor Standards Act will be tasked with the continued  
12 implementation of this legislation.

13 A) This includes the U.S. Department of Labor and its other  
14 relevant offices

15 B) All agencies with oversight over the legislation shall be  
16 authorized to penalize any and all employers in violation of this  
17 law in accordance with any relevant parts of 29 USC 206.

18 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall be null and void.

## **A Bill to Ban Use of Artificial Intelligence by Public School Students in the United States**

1 Be it enacted by the Palm Beach Forensic League Student Congress here  
2 assembled that:

3 Article I: The use of artificial intelligence (A.I.) tools by students in public K-  
4 12 educational institutions is hereby prohibited to ensure academic  
5 integrity and promote critical thinking skills. Teachers will have  
6 mandatory training on how to find the use of A.I. and will be  
7 provided with A.I. detectors to check students work.

8 Article II: For the purpose of this legislation, "A.I." refers to any software or  
9 system that performs tasks typically requiring human intelligence,  
10 including but not limited to language processing, data analysis, and  
11 automated decision-making.

12 Article III: The Department of Education shall oversee the enforcement of this  
13 legislation.

14 A. Enforcement will be conducted through regular audits at  
15 educational institutions, where compliance will be assessed,  
16 and violations will result in penalties.

17 B. Penalties include funding cuts if the widespread use of A.I. is  
18 found.

19 C. The Department of Education will provide teachers with  
20 continually updated A.I. detectors.

21 Article IV: Legislation will take effect on FY 2025, August 1.

22 Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and  
23 void.
