

A Bill to End Military Support to Saudi Arabia

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **Article I.** The United States shall halt the sale of weaponry or provide tactical and
3 strategic intelligence to the nation of Saudi Arabia.

4 **Article II.** A) The sale of weaponry shall be defined as the transfer or sale of
5 weapons, including but not limited to battle tanks, machine guns,
6 and ammunition.

7 B) Tactical and strategic intelligence shall be defined as the sharing of
8 military tactics, logistics, as well as aerial refueling.

9 **Article III.** The U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Political-Military Affairs in
10 conjunction with the Department of Defense shall oversee implementation
11 of this bill.

12 **Article IV.** This legislation shall go into effect on January 1st, 2021.

13 **Article V.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
14 and void.

A Bill to Reallocate Federal Police Funding to Law Enforcement Professionalism

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here
2 assembled that:

3 **Article I:** A) The United States shall withhold 15% of all federal funds previously
4 going toward police departments.

5 B) The House of Representatives shall form a Committee on Police
6 Professionalism to biannually review, define, and publish the expectations
7 of law enforcement.

8 C) Coinciding with federal elections, citizens will vote whether 0%, 50%,
9 or 100% of the funds will be returned to their county's police department.

10 **Article II:** Federal funds shall be defined as money provided by the federal
11 government to be directed toward a singular objective. Police departments
12 shall be defined as the organization sanctioned by local government to
13 enforce laws.

14 **Article III:** This legislation will take effect on November 3, 2021

15 **Article IV:** The Department of Justice will oversee the formation of the Committee on
16 Police Professionalism. In addition, they will manage the reappropriation
17 of funds to the states following a local vote.

18 A) All funds that are prematurely absorbed by the Department of
19 Justice will go toward the execution of this legislation.

20 **Article V:** All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall be null and void.

A Bill To Make Higher Education More Affordable

1 Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress
2 here assembled that:

3 **Article I:** By making Higher Education More Affordable, more citizens
4 will be able to receive a college education. A government
5 mandate will be enacted to make public colleges tuition free by
6 reallocating 80 billion dollars from the military to higher
7 education every year.

8 **Article II:** Public colleges will be defined as colleges primarily funded by
9 state and government, and will need to be transparent with how
10 money allocated to them was spent.

11 **Article III:** This bill will go into effect in the first month of fiscal year
12 2022.

13 **Article IV:** The U.S. The Department of Education will oversee the
14 collection of money and the implementation of the collected
15 funds.

16 **Article V:** All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall
17 hereby be declared null and void.

A Bill to Reinforce our American Driver's Safety Act (R.O.A.D.S Act)

Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here assembled that:

1 **Article I:** The amount of funding given to all interstate highways and
2 that lie within the jurisdiction of the federal government will be equally
3 funded by both the state and the federal government.

4 **Article II:** A) The American Driver's Safety Act is defined as the mandatory federal
5 safety standards for motor vehicles.

6 B) Equally funded is defined as matched funding provided by state and the
7 federal government

8 C) Interstate highways will be defined as the controlled-access highway
9 network

10 **Article III:** This bill will be implemented in the fiscal year of 2021

11 **Article IV:** This bill will be enforced by the Department of Transportation

12 A) The Department of Transportation will disperse grants to each state
equal

13 in value to the amount that each state spends on transportation.

14 B) The sum of these grants shall not exceed \$150 billion annually.

15 **Article V:** All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be
16 declared null and void.

A Bill to Provide Humanitarian Aid to Syria

1 *Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here*

6 **Article II:** Humanitarian aid shall be defined as food, water, and medicine.

7 **Article III:** This bill shall be implemented on October 1st, 2021.

8 **Article IV:** The United States Agency for International Development (USAID) shall
9 be tasked with the implementation and enforcement of this legislation.

10 A) USAID shall report to this Congress annually regarding the
11 distribution of humanitarian aid and the usage of funds.

12 B) If USAID deems that the funds are being misused, then USAID
13 shall attempt to revoke all available funds.

14 **Article V:** All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall be null and void.

A Bill to Restrict Gun Ownership For People With A Medical Marijuana Card

1 Be it enacted by this PBCFL Student Congress here assembled that:

2 **Article I:** While citizens are in possession of a medical marijuana card there shall be
3 restrictions on their ability to purchase a firearm.

4 **Article II:** Medical marijuana is defined as the use of prescribed marijuana used to
5 cope with an underlying health condition.

6 **Article III:** This Bill will go into effect on January 1, 2021.

7 **Article IV:** The government agencies that shall oversee this bill are the Department of
8 Health and Department of Homeland Security.

9 **Article V:** All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall be invalid.

A Bill to Legalize Cocaine, LSD, and Marijuana

1 *Be it enacted by this PBCFL Student Congress here assembled that:*

2 **Article I:** The medical or recreational use, manufacturing, sale, and solicitation of
3 Cocaine, LSD, and Marijuana shall be legal for citizens, ages 21 and older.
4 Distribution of these substances shall be licensed by the federal
5 government. Citizens shall only be allowed small amounts for personal
6 use.

7 **Article II:** Solicitation shall be defined as the act or an instance of requesting or
8 seeking to obtain something. Personal use shall be defined as
9 noncommercial use by an individual user.

10 **Article III:** This bill shall go into effect at the beginning of Fiscal Year 2023.

11 **Article IV:** The enforcement of this legislation shall be overseen by the Food and
12 Drug Administration.

13 **Article V:** All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be
14 declared null and void.

The Undocumented Migrant Asylum (U.M.A.) Act

1 *Be it enacted by this Student Congress here assembled that:*

2 **ARTICLE 1.** The U.M.A. act allows un-documented human migrants to be given a
3 chance of redeeming citizenship legally, without any undo consequences.

4 **ARTICLE 2.** Redeeming citizenship legally is defined as being granted common
5 American rights of a legal immigrant through special, distinctive
6 procedures. Un-documented migrants must follow distinctive rules, to
7 legally receive citizenship:

- 8 a. Must register for special naturalization progress at USCIS
9 facilities.
- 10 b. They will be given a visa stating that they are able, and legal to
11 work, and **MUST** find an eligible, and sustainable career.
- 12 c. Must pay **ALL** forms and types of taxes as American citizens.
- 13 d. Committing any serious felony, and or being given more than 5
14 illegal notices, such as speeding tickets, will result in either
15 immediate deportation, or criminal trials.

16 **ARTICLE 3.** The United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) shall
17 oversee the implementation and effect of this bill

18 **ARTICLE 4.** This legislation shall go into effect within the fiscal year 2021.

19 **ARTICLE 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Increase Military Presence in the South China Sea

A Bill to Amend the Minimum Wage Standards

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **Article 1:** Section 3(m) of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 shall be removed.

3 Section 14(c) of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 shall be removed.

4 **Article 2:** The federal minimum wage shall be defined as the lowest wage per hour a
5 worker may be paid under federal law.

6 a. The removal of Section 3(m) shall allow for tipped employees to
7 be paid the federal minimum wage, not sub-minimum wage.

8 b. The removal of Section 14(c) shall allow for disabled employees to
9 be paid the federal minimum wage, not sub-minimum wage.

10 **Article 3:** This bill will be enacted at the start of Fiscal Year 2021-22.

11 **Article 4:** The U.S. Department of Labor shall oversee the implementation of this
12 legislation.

13 **Article 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Make Sex Education a Graduation Requirement

1 *BE IT ENACTED BY THIS PBCFL CONGRESS THAT:*

2 **ARTICLE 1:** The United States will make sex education a graduation requirement by having
3 each state and local municipality adopt standards which teach students about
4 sexual education. The course can be taken online or in person and the students
5 must pass a formal exam in order for the class to be considered complete.

6 **ARTICLE 2:** Sex education is the instruction of issues relating to human sexuality, including
7 but not limited to: emotional relations and responsibilities, human sexual
8 anatomy, sexually transmitted diseases, sexual activity, sexual reproduction, age
9 of consent, reproductive health, reproductive rights, safe sex, birth control and
10 sexual abstinence.

11 **ARTICLE 3:** State and local Education Departments and School Districts will oversee the
12 implementation of this bill within their jurisdictions. The U.S. The Department
13 of Education will oversee the implementation of this bill and that states and
14 local municipalities comply. Any schools or school districts that do not comply
15 will lose federal funding until they are brought into compliance.

16 **ARTICLE 4:** The law will take effect in the 2023-2024 school year

17 **ARTICLE 5:** Any laws or statutes in conflict with the bill are considered null and void.
