PROJECT: RESEARCH, INTEGRATION AND PRESENTATION

During the third quarter, you will select a book where the subject matter and focus directly connect with, support, or clarify your chosen speech and debate event. This book must be published, non-fiction, and substantial in scope, reference and credibility. All book selections must be approved by the instructor. Once a selection has been made, the following requirements must be met:

1. First Proposal – one page typed explanation of reason for choosing your book; how it is related to or linked with your event; in what way will it strengthen, improve, or clarify your event (such as, through better understanding, instruction on performance, addition of depth of knowledge of subject matter, etc.).

2. Outline – typed outline of your written analysis (book should be completely read at this point).

3. Second Proposal – one page typed explanation of oral presentation; outline of analysis, material and information to be presented; include what and how technology will be integrated.

4. Rough Draft – typed rough draft of five page paper; should include documentation, quotations, analysis of content of book, explanation of how book relates to, supports and strengthens your performance, understanding and knowledge of event.

5. Final Draft – revised and perfected typed five page paper; include all information from rough draft, plus modifications and improvements; all information must be documented via the MLA format (parenthetical citations, works cited page, etc.); the works cited page is separate from the five pages.

6. Oral Presentation – presentation of book and analysis; you should *not* read your report. This should be a well-organized, informative and creative presentation. Some type of technology must be used and integrated as part of your presentation.

7. Self Evaluation – assessment and critiques by peers of proposals, rough draft, final draft, and oral presentation.
